Caution: Please read all instructions before assembly and check the carton for any parts that may have come loose during shipment. It is recommended to use two or more people during the assembly process.

Install legs (C) (D) at each corner of the console (A) and secure in place using a bolt (2) with spring washer (3) and flat washer (4). Adjust levelers if needed.

Install center support leg (E) and secure in place using dowels (6) and bolt (2) with spring washer (3) and flat washer (4). Adjust levelers if needed.

- Always use protective pads under hot dishes and plates. Heat can cause chemical changes that may create spotting within the furniture finish.
- In the event that your furniture is stained or otherwise damaged during use, we recommend that you call a professional to repair your furniture.

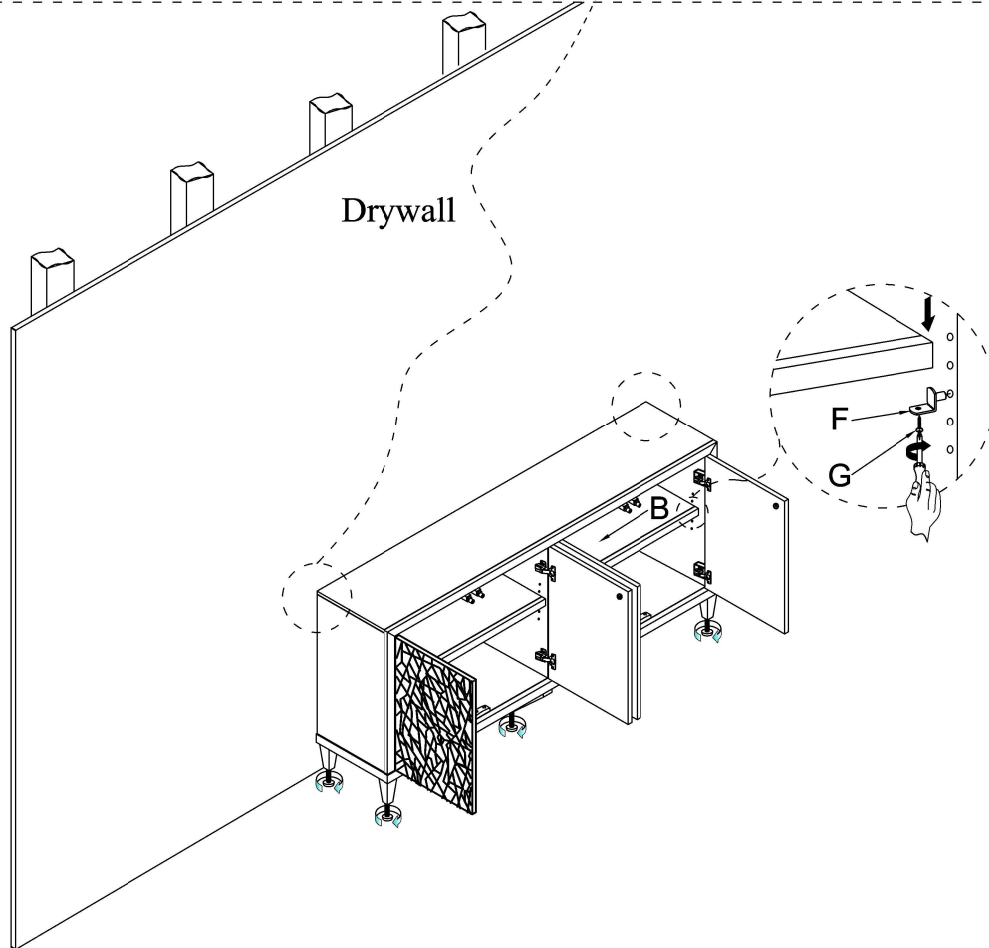
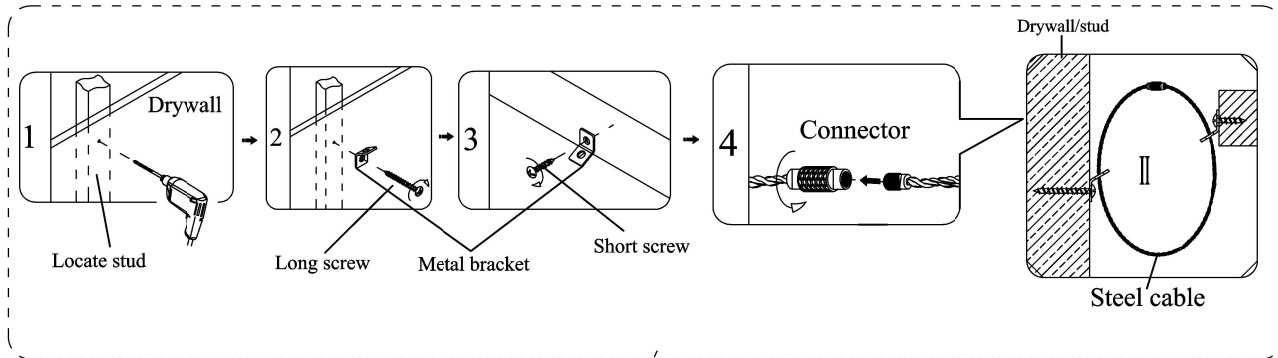
The Shelves (B) are secured in place with screws (G) through a metal shelf pin (F) for packing and shipping. To adjust shelf height, loosen the screws and remove the shelf and the shelf pins. Position the shelf pins at desired height, place the shelf on the shelf pins and tighten with screws as shown in the illustration.

**Tool Required: Philip Screw Driver ( not provided )**

Anti-tip hardware kit must always be used to prevent the unit from tipping. Attach anti-tip restraint at top of the console.
